CONSERVATION RULES

IF YOU ARE READING THIS YOUR HOME IS IN A CONSERVATION AREA

In June 2007 the City Council sent an "Advisory Leaflet" to us all. It said:

"I am pleased to be able to send you a copy of the advisory leaflet for the Toxteth Park and Avenues Conservation Area, designated by the City Council on 29 April 2005. Your property is within the conservation area. This affects normal planning rules that apply in the area."

Perhaps you've forgotten, or were not living in the area then. However, remember that special planning rules apply to housing in this area, and they must be followed. If you're a tenant, show this to your landlord.

YOU MUST GET PLANNING PERMISSION

for any work to the front, sides, and sometimes, the back of your house. This means **windows, doors, walls, fences, gates, roofs, gutters, doorsteps and brickwork**. Changing windows or removing front doors and installing the wrong ones has a tremendously ugly effect upon our lovely Victorian homes. If you carry out renovation work incorrectly you will have to apply for retrospective planning permission and then have work you've paid for rejected. You will be asked to comply with the Conservation Area Rules by removing incorrect renovations and doing the work again properly.

CARRYING OUT WORK?

Look up "Liverpool City Council Planning and Building Control" online where there's information. Planning Permission can be applied for there. Or phone the department on 0151 233 3021, or write to Planning and Building Control, Municipal Buildings, Dale Street, Liverpool L2 2DH.

FIRE HYDRANTS

Contrary to what you see in American movies, UK fire hydrants are not overground pillars easily noticed, they are small manhole covers. In these sweltering temperatures particularly, it is very important to think before you park. (Parking on the pavement is never a good idea anyway). Please heed the fire brigade's advice:

“In the event of fire, it can be of paramount importance that firefighters have access to water supplies quickly and every second counts! Obstruction of fire hydrants, particularly through inconsiderate parking, could place the lives of you, your family and your neighbours at risk.

A person commits an offence if he / she damages or obstructs a fire hydrant, and is liable to prosecution. (Fire and Rescue Services Act Section 42).”
